ANSWERS TO QUIZ #2 APPEAR AT THE END OF QUIZ #3

Q1. True or False: If the clock is stopped for an inadvertent whistle, and the down is replayed, the game clock is started on the RFP.

Q2. Play: A's pass is intercepted by B10 who then fumbles during the return and A33 recovers inbounds. The game clock is started:

- A. On the snap
- B. On the RFP

Q3. Play: K's 4th down legal punt is blocked but K23 recovers behind the NZ and carries it beyond the line to gain. When does the clock start?

- A. On the snap
- B. On the RFP

Q4. Same as Q3 except the legal kick occurs on 3rd down; but K23 does not reach the line to gain. When does the clock start?

- A. On the snap
- B. On the RFP (if it was stopped)

Q5. Play: 4/10 for K; K's legal punt rolls to a stop inbounds at the 50. K was in illegal formation at the snap. R accepts the penalty and elects to have it enforced from the previous spot. When does the game clock start?

- A. On the snap
- B. On the RFP

Q6. True or False: When administration of a penalty is one of the reasons for the game clock to stop, the result of the previous play is always the determining factor on starting the game clock

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Q7. True or False: The clock always starts on the snap following a Delay of Game penalty.

Q8. True or False: Following a legal kick, when a new series is awarded to either team, the play clock will be set at 25 seconds.

Q9. True or False: When a play ends in bounds and A has reached the line to gain, the 40 second clock begins to run when the ball is set (silent wind).

Q10: True or False: When a penalty is accepted with less than 2 minutes remaining in any period, the offended team may opt to have the clock started on the snap.

Q11. In Q9, if the game clock IS stopped, when should it be restarted?

- A. On the snap
- B. On the RFP
- C. As soon as it is determined A has maintained possession

Q12. Play: Late in the game, B trails by 2 points and has no time outs remaining. A is (legally) “milking” the play clock. Following A’s 3rd down play, that ends in bounds, B55 a) appears to be injured or b) loses his helmet. Officials stop the game clock and B55 is removed from the field. When should the play clock be set?

- A. At 25 seconds in “a”
- B. At 40 seconds in “b”
- C. At 25 seconds in both “a” and “b”
- D. At 40 seconds in both “a” and “b”

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Q13. TRUE or FALSE: Periods are extended:

- A. Any time a down is replayed
- B. Time expires during the down
- C. Only when B commits a live ball foul
- D. Only when A fouls
- E. When dead ball fouls, non-player fouls, or USC fouls are accepted
- F. Following a foul by the defense on a TD (for the try – if required)
- G. Following a safety
- H. Following a loss of down penalty
- I. When B fouls during a successful try or FG and the scoring team elects the result of the play and to enforce the foul from the succeeding spot
- J. For the kick-off following a TD for a foul by the non-scoring team

Q14. Which fouls MAY carry over into OT?

- A. Team B fouls during a successful try
- B. Team R fouls during a successful field goal
- C. Fouls by the non-scoring team on a TD play

Q15. True or False: When a game is tied at the end of regulation, each team is awarded one additional time out added to any remaining from regulation play.

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Q16. Play: A does not score in their 1st OT series. B (now A) decides to attempt a field goal on 1st down – which is blocked. A50 picks up the loose ball at the 15 and rumbles to the 5 when H blows his whistle.

Ruling?

- B. The correct call – A's series ended when A50 gained possession
- C. An IW. A may choose to replay the down
- D. An IW, A may choose to accept the result of the play -2/goal from the 5

Q17. Play: Same play as Q16 - but A (now the defense) recovers the loose ball followed by the H's whistle. Ruling?

- A. The correct call – 1st and goal for A from the B10 yd line.
- B. The correct call – move to the next OT period.
- C. An IW. B may choose to replay the down
- D. An IW. A may choose to replay the down
- E. An IW, A may choose to accept the result of the play -2/goal from the 5

Q18. Same play as Q16; but this time the R blows his whistle while the ball is loose. Ruling?

- A. The correct call - 2/goal for B from the 15
- B. The correct call – move on to the second OT period
- C. An IW; the down must be replayed by rule

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Q19. Play: In the first OT period, Team A scores a TD. During the successful try, B roughs the kicker. Ruling?

- A. By rule, A must decline the penalty. Score the point and move to B's OT series
- B. A may accept the penalty, choose to enforce the penalty from the previous spot, and retry the point from the 1 ½ yd line
- C. A may accept the penalty, choose to score the point and penalize B from the succeeding spot – forcing B to begin their series at the 25 yd line

Q20. Play: On 1st down in OT, A10 drops to pass and is forced out of the pocket – ultimately tackled at the B28. During his scramble, a) A55 holds at the B22; or b) A10 is tackled by the facemask at the B28 by B54. Option(s)?

- A. B accepts: 1st and 10 for A from the B38 in “a”
- B. B accepts: 1st and goal for A from the B38 in “a”
- C. B accepts: 1st and goal for A from the B32 in “a”
- D. B declines: 2nd and 10 for A from the B22 in “a”
- E. B declines: 2nd and goal for A from the B28 in “a”
- F. A accepts: 1st and 10 for A from the B14 in “b”
- G. A accepts: 1st and goal for A from the B14 in “b”
